Dear Scott,

This letter aims at inviting you (or your co-workers) to submit a manuscript to a special issue of Plant Science entitled « From genomics to breeding ».

More than 60 genomes are now available, at least as a reasonably good quality draft and sometimes for multiple varieties. One of the ultimate goal of sequencing plant genomes is to improve traits of the corresponding crops. It is now time to illustrate how we have started to use the genomic information to improve a number of crops. We propose to edit a special issue of Plant Science to present a number of successful stories as a proof of concept.

We would like to invite both review and original research papers (but predominantly original research papers) in the field of using genomics to facilitate breeding. We welcome general methodology papers as well as papers focusing on particular traits. All submited papers will be peer-reviewed as usual in our journal. If you are interested in contributing to such an issue, please send me a preliminary tittle and a short abstract as soon as possible and I shall send you a formal invitation letter, if I feel that your proposal fits with our project. I would also appreciate that you give me the names and adress of colleagues who have interesting results in this

field and might be interested to submit a paper. Our schedule deadlines are receiving manuscripts not later than April 15, accepting definitively papers by July 31 and publishing during fall 2015, thus coinciding with the 15th anniversary of release of the Arabidopsis genome sequence and the 10th anniversary of that of rice.

I hope that you will positively answer to my invitation and that you would help us to make Plant Science a more and more successful Journal.

Plant Science is a journal focusing on physiological, biochemical and genetical mechanisms underlying plant biological, agonomical and technological characters, including molecular breeding. During the last 10 years Plant Science Impact Factor has raised from 1.3 to 4.1 in 2013.
